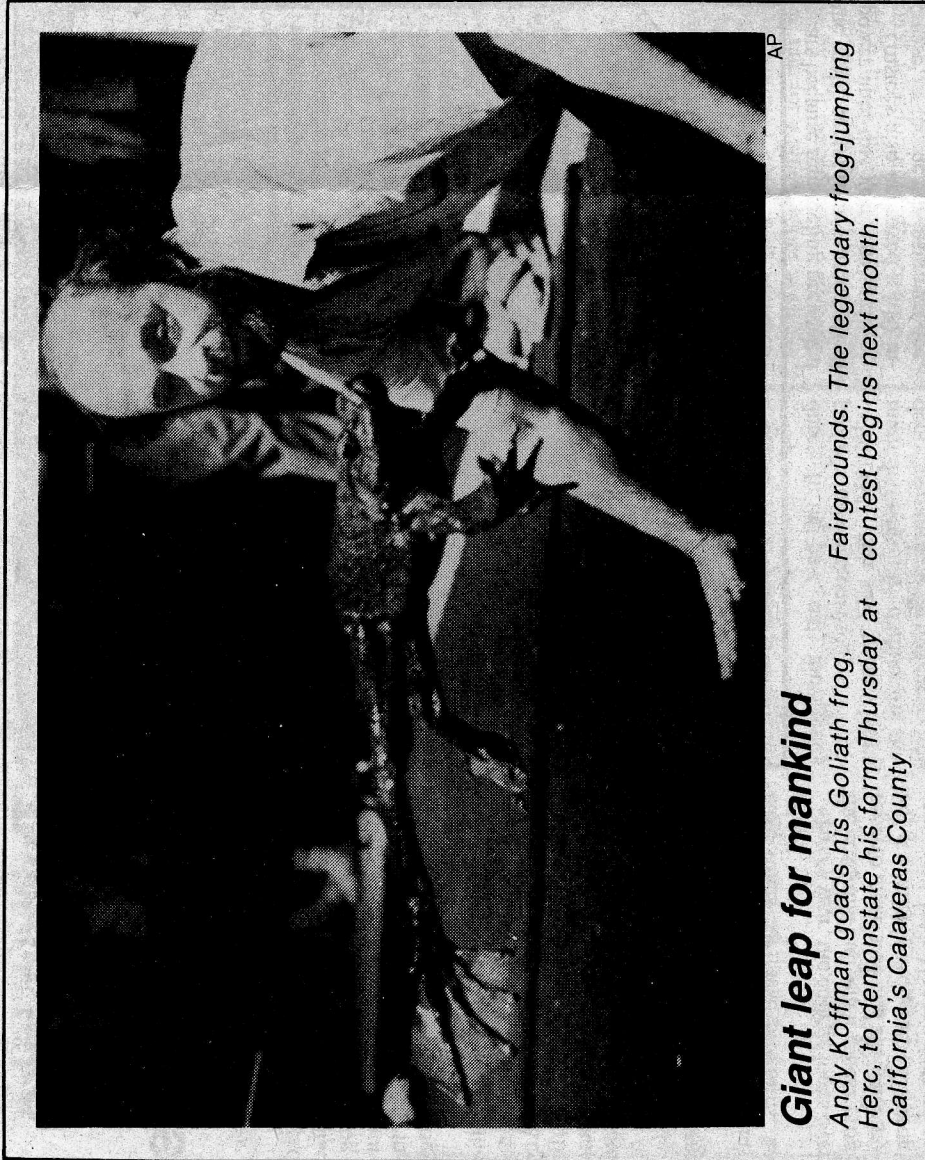

Martin, Simon open debate over clean air, environment

WASHINGTON (AP)—U.S. Rep. Lynn Martin's criticism of U.S. Sen. Paul Simon's vote against a clean-air bill has opened debate over who is a better friend of the environment.

Martin, R-Loves Park, is seeking Simon's job in the fall election. She portrayed herself as a protector of the outdoors last week when she said she would have supported the bill. It would strengthen air-pollution law for the first time in 13 years.

Simon, D-Ill., was alarmed at the bill's impact on Illinois miners and coal-burning utilities. He was one of 11 senators who opposed the legislation.

"My overall record is a strong one," he said in defense. "My opponent's overall environmental record is not."

"He's free to put it up," Martin countered. "You can't say, 'I'm really strong for the environment yet I voted against clean air.'"

Who can settle it?

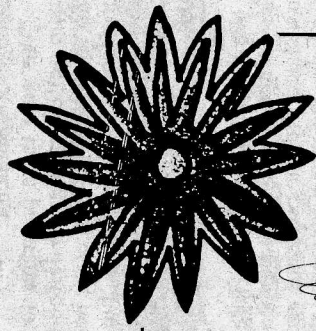
The League of Conservation Voters gives Simon the nod.

The 20-year-old group, which serves as the political voice of the country's major environmental organizations, analyzes the votes of each lawmaker on issues related to the outdoors. It gives scores ranging from zero to 100.

During the past decade, Simon's ratings were usually in the 80s, except for 1987-88 when he ran for president and missed dozens of Senate votes. He scored 90 in 1989.

Martin, meanwhile, has never topped 63, the score she received in 1981, her first year in the House. Her lowest rating was 26 in 1985-86.

"I don't know this group," Martin replied when asked about her scores. "If that's true, then it's indicative of her concern for the environment," said Carl Zichella of the Sierra Club's Midwest office. "The League of Conservation Voters is one of the best known environmental lobbies in Washington."
